Progress in the provision of technical assistance and capacity building support:

The Ministry of Trade in an effort to minimise delays at the border started developing border facilities to the OSBP status with the neighbouring countries. The Concept is aimed at reducing the number of stops and processes associated with cross border transactions to ease trade and movement of people. Six Borders - Mwanza/Zobue; Songwe/Kisumulu; Dedza/Colomue Mchinji/Mwami Chiponde/Mandimba; and Muloza/Quelimane were prioritized. One border of Mchinji/Mwami between Malawi and Zambia has so far been completed.

The government of Malawi obtained loans from African Development Bank and the World Bank Group to finance construction of the borders. However, inadequate resources to fully roll out the concept at the selected borders is the challenge.

Progress in the provision of technical assistance and capacity building support:

The Ministry of Trade embarked on establishment of the Electronic Single Window system in the country. Feasibility study was completed in 2019 and implementation structures put in place in 2020. The project implementation is in progress amid tight budget. The project is being financed by the Malawi Government through a loan obtained from the World Bank Group.

Technical Assistance required:

Support for designs, acquisition of IT infrastructure, establishment and trainings.
