- WTO Needs Assessment 2012
- OCO Feasibility Study 2013
 - Identified Agencies don't have Automated systems
 - Recommended for ASYCUDA World to be the Single Window System (existing capacity, HR and ICT)
 - Agencies to be integrated, with respective modules
 - NTDC endorsed this approach
- Upgrade to ASYCUDA World Project to be the first-phase of the Single Window Project

BACKGROUND



- ASYCUDA World Project (2016-2018)
 - USD 1 million (Vanuatu Government)
- Electronic Single Window System Project (2019-2021)
 - USD 2 million (EIF USD 1.5million, AusAid and Vanuatu Government in-kind contribution)
- 2nd Phase being negotiated (for other OGA's) Art. 10.4
- Humanitarian Supplies ASYREC module (AusAid)
- Link ASYCUDA to Postal CDS system (EIF)





- Assist Vanuatu to implement remaining WCO recommendations as contained in the RKC, the SAFE Framework of Standards, to Secure and Facilitate Global Trade and other international instruments,
- Assist Vanuatu Customs provide services online and exchange data with the private sector, other government departments and other Customs organizations,
- Keep up with the evolved customs clearance processes and the trade environment have evolved over the years.



The Vanuatu National Single Window is powered by ASYCUDAWorld





To **Customs** and its **External** Stakeholders

- Clearance can be conducted prior to arrival (Art. 7.1)
 - Advance submission of manifests
 - ASYCUDA Post CDS interface Project
- Real-time online payment implemented (Art. 7.2)
- Risk Management targeting only 40% of consignments (Art. 7.4)
- Scanned documents assisting with clearance and audits (Art. 7.5)



STATULE LECTRONO STATULE WINDOW PROSE

To **Customs** and its **External** Stakeholders

- Increased in efficient clearance process (2018 2019)
 - Despite a decrease of imports value (CIF) by around 10%, revenue collection decreased by only 0.5%
 - Export value (FOB) increased by around 8%
- Effect of the pandemic (2020)
 - Decrease of imports value (CIF) by 6.3% from 2019
 - Revenue collection decreased by 9.2% from 2019
 - Export value (FOB) decreased by 36% from 2019



ITS



- To All **External** VeSW Stakeholders
- LPCO and Clearance procedures are now more transparent, predictable, consistent, and therefore fast and efficient
- Access to Payment facility for deferred payments (Art. 7.2)
- Online availability of data and procedures
- Improved conformity with regulatory requirements
- Online processing (little to no physical contact)





Environmental Impact with the automation of Biosecurity

- Reduced cost in paper (95% 100% reduction)
- Reduced trips to Biosecurity offices (86% 100% reductions)
- Power Consumption at the Government Data Centre unaffected





- To All **Internal** Stakeholders
- Relieve Officers to focus on effective compliance
- Online processing (can work remotely)
- Reduced cost in paper
- Improved border control, automatically linking LPCO's to Customs clearance
- Harmonised risk management (Art. 7.4)
- Interagency cooperation improved, uniform application of procedures
- Data integrity improved, real-time data availability
- Facilitate revenue collection, consistent across all offices






- System and database servers are hosted at the Government Data Centre
- System now has over 370 registered users, both in Government and in the Private sector
- System application has 2 fulltime Administrators with support from Customs ICT team
- Each module in Customs and OGA have their own Key Business Users
- Support from ASMP and UNCTAD team, for development and maintenance
